



Conditions for Admission to Membership of FISITA

Any automotive engineering society applying for membership in FISITA must subscribe to the purpose of FISITA and contribute accordingly to FISITA. Application for FISITA membership must be submitted on the official application form and must respond to questions or requests for information as required by the Council.

All documents must be drawn up in, or translated into English, the official language, of FISITA.

A letter from the applicant society must accompany the application form and must include that society's acceptance of FISITA's rules and regulations and a willingness to apply them in spirit and in practice. The application should contain the following information or documents:

- A copy of the society's rules and regulations in force on the date of application.
- An excerpt from the national legislation covering the society's legal status.
- A copy of the three most recent annual reports on the society's main activities.
- Details of the society's purposes and goals.
- The membership figures for all grades of membership in the society and qualifications required for admission to each grade.
- The name, status, affiliation and titles of members of the society's top administrative body or board of directors.
- A description of the automotive activities in the applicant society's country showing the extent to which motor vehicles are designed, manufactured, and utilised, including annual numbers vehicles produced and sold, and the approximate number of automotive engineers and technicians employed in the country.
- The names and addresses of all other societies or groups of automotive engineers in the applicant society's country and their membership figures.
- A brief description of technical activities, e.g. conferences, meetings and their frequency, location, size and source of audiences.
- Number of technical papers published per annum and languages used.
- Titles of series/publications produced and languages used.

The Council reserves the right to supplement their knowledge gained from the written submission by sending a mission of Council Officers or Delegates to meet the applicant.
